

From the Second Missionary Baptist Church founded in 1866 and rooted in rich African American heritage, to the Missouri United Methodist Church built in 1929 whose stained glass windows depict stories of the Old and New Testament, the religious and architectural history is outstanding. Learn about the A.P. Green Chapel, an addition to Memorial Union on the Campus of the University of Missouri and tour Stephen's College Firestone Baars Chapel designed by Eero Saarinen, of St. Louis Arch fame. As there is so much to explore and experience, all itineraries can be customized to fit the needs of the group. The churches included on this itinerary are conveniently located within the downtown Columbia footprint, which makes adding activities, including lunch on your own, or together as a group easy.

However, the Mormon Church (Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints), the Community of Christ (formerly Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints), and Church of Christ (Temple Lot) share a profound Independence heritage. Independence religious heritage sites help bring to life the story of these churches' pursuit of religious freedom in the Heartland.

All are invited to put a mother's name on the Mother's Wall regardless of religious beliefs.

St. Charles St. Charles prides itself on being the home to some of the oldest churches in the region and in the state of Missouri. St. Charles Borromeo is the third oldest parish in the St. Louis Archdiocese going back to 1791. A replica of the typical French log church with vertical posts began being constructed in 2004 by members of the community. The work done completely by hand with period tools, in the manner of 18th century, and was completed in 2008. Shrine of Saint Philippine Duchesne – is a lasting tribute to the French Missionary Religious of the Sacred Heart. The Old Peace Chapel – originally built as general store in 1828, remodeled into a church by a German Evangelical congregation, and today is the centerpiece of the village in the

Many of these structures are over 100 years old and among the oldest buildings still standing in St. Joseph. One of the finest examples of Gothic Revival architecture in northwest Missouri is designed by Edmund J. Eckel, who created many of our architectural jewels. Explore the stained-glass windows imported from Austria along with "Tiffany" windows, bell towers and pipe organs. One can't help but be awed by these beauties. They are works of art as well as places of worship

Built on the site of that first church in 1834, the Old Cathedral know officially as the Basilica of St. Louis the King is located on the edge of the Gateway Arch National Park grounds. The city's burgeoning population soon outgrew the elegant riverfront cathedral, so a larger church was built in the city's Central West End neighborhood. In 1909, the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis – called the "New Cathedral" by the locals was completed, but it took several decades before the 83,000 square feet of detailed interior mosaics were completed. The collection is one of the largest in the Western hemisphere.



Truman was staying when he received word about becoming Vice President. The Benton County Courthouse, re-built in 1886 and the Benton County Jailhouse, which is just west of the Courthouse, are both historical buildings. The Joe Dice Swinging Bridge was the first suspension bridge and is one of 15 remaining swinging bridges that once crossed the Osage River. The Harry S. Truman Dam & Reservoir was completed after 15 years of development and construction, beginning in 1964. Warsaw maintains its downtown riverfront roots with boat docking facilities and the Drake Harbor Recreation Area, which overlooks the beautiful Osage River/Lake of the Ozarks.

With a history dating back to 1869 and to the childhood and wartime days of the outlaw brothers Jesse and Frank James, Kearney's charming, store-lined square is a historic gem. History flows through Excelsior Springs like the mineral water that helped found the town in 1880. Visit the Hall of Waters to see Excelsior's past come to life in this marvelous Art-Deco, Depression Modern styled hall first opened in 1937.

Clinton The Greater Clinton-Area Chamber of Commerce and Clinton Main Street welcomes you. Clinton is located at the intersection of MO Highways 7, 13, 52, and 18. The Historic Downtown Square, the largest square district in MO, offers a Victorian setting. Browse through shops, where you will find jewelry, clothing, quilting supplies, a bookstore, restaurants, the visitor's center and an array of gifts. Our Henry County Museum and Cultural Arts Complex, located in an old Anheuser Busch building, takes you back in time and is worth seeing. In the middle of it all is the Henry Co. Courthouse, which dates to 1893. As you soak in the small town atmosphere, don't miss the Memorial Bandstand, the Soldiers Memorial, the 9/11 Memorial and the granite Historic Fountain that was donated to Clinton in 1911 by the Human Alliance Foundation. You won't want to miss the Boone County History and Culture Center's Village at Boone Junction, a planned village consisting of historic structures relocated from their original locations in Boone County and placed together for easy exploring. The village features a log cabin built circa 1820, a family-owned and operated country store, and two architecturally diverse homes. In addition to the history village, your group can tour the 1877 Maplewood Home, built in 1877 by one of Boone County's pioneer families. Anchoring your visit is the museum itself which includes rotating history exhibits as well as the vibrant art displayed in the Montminy Art Gallery. The park provides plenty of shade; an opportunity for strolling or resting on a bench and there is plenty of space: indoor or outdoor to enjoy a catered meal.

Just east of the Capitol on Jefferson Street, is the Jefferson Landing State Historic Site, which is home to some of the city's oldest buildings, including the Christopher Maus House, Union Hotel, and the Lohman Building Store and Warehouse. Just around the corner on Madison Street is the Missouri Governor's Mansion, complemented by the Carnahan Memorial Garden, both flaunting beautiful architecture and landscaping. Directly across the street from the Capitol building on High Street is the Supreme Court of Missouri, the state's highest court, built in 1907 using funds from the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis.

One of the oldest and largest Historic Districts in Missouri, Main Street's brick-paved road, authentic gas lamps, and fourteen blocks of preserved 19th century architecture provide the perfect backdrop to explore its more than 125 unique shops and boutiques. Feeling hungry? Over 25 diverse restaurants are sure to satisfy any craving. The past collides with the present as each year Main Street hosts dozens of special events. Concerts, art fairs, cultural celebrations, and acclaimed holiday festivals attract guests of all ages from around the country. We invite you to discover historic Main Street, where the past comes to life and timeless memories are created every day.

St. Louis Lafayette Square just located south of downtown St. Louis centers on a collection of "painted ladies," a set of stately Victorian homes that surround beautiful Lafayette Park. The park also includes one-of-a-kind restaurants, bars, specialty shops, and bed-and-breakfast inns. Twice a year, the residents of Lafayette Square generously open their homes for annual tours. Lafayette Park is St. Louis' oldest historic district, and also designated National Historic District. Soulard Farmers Market had humble beginnings in 1779 as a flat meadow that farmers could come and sell their locally raised fruit, vegetables, dairy, and livestock. It is one of the oldest public markets in the U.S. and the oldest farmers market west of the Mississippi.

Warrensburg Explore Warrensburg's historic downtown! The area is filled with locally owned, unique shopping, dining and more. No visit to the historic area is complete without a picture or two with the Old Drum statue located on the Johnson County Courthouse lawn. The Old Drum trial held in Warrensburg, the county seat, in the late 1800's inspired the phrase, Man's Best Friend. When you visit, you might just find an event happening downtown. Warrensburg Main Street offers 70+ events year round including the Warrensburg Farmers' Market on Saturday mornings around the Courthouse from May through early October.







It is one block away from the home of infamous outlaw Jesse James, where he was shot and killed by Bob Ford. After his death, the James family stayed and were interviewed in the hotel. Patee House Museum features two full floors of exhibits. Inside Patee House, you can climb aboard an 1860 train and ride the vintage "Wild Thing" carousel. The museum also houses an 1877 railroad depot, stagecoach, cars, trucks, fire trucks, wagons, buggies and carriages, Jeeps, a racecar, horse-drawn hearses and a real gallows, a blacksmith shop, dressmaker's shop, model railroads, antique furniture and toys, a wing with Western art by artist George Warfel, and a wing designed to look like the Streets of Old St. Jo in the 1860s-1880s.
